10.4 AMM Resolution - Drainage Restriction Changes

WHEREAS in the Province of Manitoba, reconnaissance soil surveys were completed between 1926 and 1996 and detailed soil surveys were completed between 1972 and 2022, classifying surface soils by their agricultural capability in accordance with the Canada Land Inventory;

AND WHEREAS the soil classifications from the Canada Land Inventory referenced in the Planning Regulation, the Water Rights Regulation, and the Nutrient Management Regulation are defined as: the mineral soils are grouped into seven classes according to their potentialities and limitations for agricultural use. Where Class 6 soils are capable only of producing perennial forage crops, and improvement practices are not feasible and Class 7 soils have no capability for arable culture or permanent pasture;

AND WHEREAS Manitoba Environment and Climate Change through the Drainage and Water Rights Licensing Branch regulate drainage within the Province of Manitoba through the Water Rights Act;

AND WHEREAS all persons including municipalities must obtain a valid and subsisting license as per the Water Rights Act;

AND WHEREAS development of land cannot take place without obtaining a valid drainage license to construct pertinent development features such as roads and ditches;

AND WHEREAS the Drainage and Water Rights Licensing Branch, as of 2019, has implemented an internal policy in which drainage licenses on Class 6 and 7 soils cannot be approved, for registrable or licensable projects;

AND WHEREAS the term registerable project is defined, separately from other licensable projects for drainage works, in the Water Rights Act. These are typically minor or less impactful drainage projects, often involving surface or subsurface drains. Registration allows for a streamlined process compared to full licensing, but still ensures compliance with regulations;

AND WHEREAS licensable applications for water control works are not restricted on Class 6 and 7 soils, only registerable projects are restricted per the Water Rights Regulation;

AND WHEREAS municipalities recognize the need to restrict development in environmentally sensitive areas and critical/significant wildlife habitats such as wetlands and habitats for migratory species;

AND WHEREAS The Planning Act, The Planning Regulation, The Environment Act, The Water Protection Act, The Water Rights Act, The Water Rights Regulation, and The Nutrient Management Regulation do not restrict the issuance of Water Control Works Licenses on Class 6 and 7 soils;

AND WHEREAS the municipalities recognize that some subclasses of Class 6 and 7 soils are strongly associated with the presence of wetlands, however development of wetlands is already limited per the Water Rights Regulation;

AND WHEREAS many subclasses of Class 6 and 7 soils are often viewed as desirable for rural subdivisions, lakeside cottage developments, and campgrounds due to their lack of agricultural capability, including soils which:

- have a restricted rooting zone depth for crops,
- contain poisonous plants to farm animals,
- are heavily forested,
- are affected by drouthiness (sandy and gravely soils),
- have high salinity,
- have high groundwater table,
- are too stony to permit cultivation, and
- have a topographic slope of greater than 31%;

AND WHEREAS the Canada Land Inventory soil classification system used in the reconnaissance and detailed soil surveys was published in 1965, this classification speaks only to agricultural uses, and predates current drainage practices and drainage regulations by 60 years; and

WHEREAS the Drainage and Water Rights Licensing Branch is applying this internal policy to all undeveloped lands on Class 6 and 7 soils, regardless of current zoning designations;

AND WHEREAS many municipalities are experiencing significant loss of developable land, portions of which have already been designated/zoned for development, from the implementation of this internal policy;

AND WHEREAS this internal policy is unnecessarily restricting development and the potential for increased tax-base of municipalities;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT the AMM lobby the Province of Manitoba to only enforce current limitations published in the Acts and Regulations, and remove the internal policy denying Water Control Works Licenses on Class 6 and 7 soils:

AND FURTHER BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Province of Manitoba engage AMM to participate as stakeholders in the preparations of future internal policies within the Drainage and Water Rights Licensing Branch to adequately evaluate the impact of these internal policies on growth and future development.

2 REPORTING SCHEDULE

The reporting schedule as determined in consultation between the RCMP and the municipalities.

3 MANAGEMENT OF THE POLICE SERVICE:

3.1 Objectives, Priorities and Goals for 2024/25:

As per previous discussion and letter of agreement. We are looking at 3 main categories this year; Traffic, Crime Reduction and Communication.

RCMP's Planned Initiatives to Meet Objectives, Priorities and Goals:

3.1.1 OBJECTIVE: Contribute to Safer Roadways

Initiative #1: Targeted Enforcement Impaired Drivers

Current Status and Results:

We have charged 3 individuals with impaired operation of a motor vehicle as an entire Area this quarter. That's 28 so far for the year. Our goal is 22 for the year and we have surpassed that.

Initiative #2: Targeted Enforcement Intersection Violations

Current Status and Results:

We were able to charge 4 persons with an intersection violation in this quarter. With that, 4 warnings were issued. Our goal is 30 for the year, so far that's 29 total. Members are on the lookout. They are finding more provincial traffic offences as a result. There have been 331 Provincial Traffic complaints made. There has been 186 charges and 47 warnings issued. We exceeding ours goals here by a large margin.

3.1.2 OBJECTIVE: Crime Reduction - Property Crimes

Initiative #1: Criminal Compliance Checks

Current Status and Results:

Our compliance check program continues to be successful. We completed 3 checks this quarter and have kept the individual on the straight and narrow.

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Initiative #2: Community Mobilization (HUB) Referrals & Restorative Justice

Current Status and Results:

We have referred no individuals to Community Mobilization in an effort to funnel them out of policing resources and get them in touch with other agencies with an appropriate mandate for their issues. Our Community Mobilization Member; Cpl Dey-Thomas has retired and has still not been replaced. There has been no word on this.

We have made no referrals to the Restorative Justice program. In this quarter there have been no suitable cases for forwarding. The Province has undergone a significant change in the Judicial system with the new Pre-Charge mandate. This mandate takes almost all control away from police and the public when deciding on who will be charged criminally and who will not be. Part of the program is to make more use of restorative justice programs, as such the Crown is now making the majority, if not the entirety of referrals.

There is now a new process for referrals, to streamline the system and make it more unified. As noted our referrals are coming out of the Crowns office. We do not track these numbers.

This has not changed since the previous reporting year.

Initiative #3: Encourage the Use of Judicial Authorizations

This quarter shows 2 search warrant written and executed with success. We are sending a member on additional training in this area for any future warrants, when that training become available.

As a result of our current numbers in these 3 areas, we are now focusing on additional training and education for the membership. Ideally, this should help us in some proactive investigations and projects. In fact, we have a very successful search warrant for stolen property. That will show up in Q1 of the upcoming reporting period.

3.1.3 OBJECTIVE: Communication

Initiative #1: Internal Communications Monitoring

Current Status and Results:

Communication levels remain at an acceptable level. We've held 4 Area meetings this year, plus a couple of informal ones, as well as performance meetings with each member.

Initiative #2: External Communication Monitoring Current Status and Results:

We hit more than 10 individual contacts over the quarter, putting us at 60 for the year. Let me know if you are seeing too much or too little of us. As previously noted, each Detachment now has a posted Corporal as your direct contact. I'm still happy to talk to you, don't worry!

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4 CURRENT ACTIVITY STATISTICS –

Please refer to the attached statistical report for the current quarter. The same quarter last year for your municipality has been included for comparison. I have also included the current and previous quarter for the Area as a whole.

4.1 TRENDS/POINTS OF INTEREST/VALUE

This quarter we had only 15 calls for service under the Mental Health Act. We had 8 reports of assault, plus 2 assault causing bodily harm/Assault with a weapon, 1 Aggravated Assault, 8 utter threats/harassment, 1 Child Pornography Possession, 2 Sexual Assaults, Invitation to Sexual touching and 1 Sextortion, plus 1 weapon trafficking. 37 requests to check the well being of individuals, 10 calls for emergency 911 response, 44 false alarms and 21 reports of suspicious people. We cleared a couple of theft files. Always a good thing. We had 13 mischiefs, 27 theft related files. We laid 2 charges for possession of stolen property over \$5000 and 2 for under \$500. We were able to do 1 organized check stop. It was a busy quarter.

Frauds in general are still climbing we had 15 reported, so be careful. If you get a call from someone claiming to be police, remember we don't ask you to send cash or e transfer or give us amazon cards. We darn sure don't tell you to keep it a secret from everyone. Listen to the bank if they warn you about pulling money out of your account, or ask you why you want the money. This is just a sample of the investigations we have engaged in. Please see your specific area report for further local details.

The members put on 48528 KMs this quarter. Keep your eyes open. We are out there!

I have included the acknowledgement of policing priority sheet that has been discussed. It shows as council for signature, meaning anyone can sign it. If you choose to sign it, you can just scan the signed copy and email it to me. This year will be more project focused, so we'll keep you up to speed on that. If you have something specific you would like to see, let us know.

As usual, call, text or email if you need to talk to me or see me. I'm around.

Subject: Removal of Approach Access to 58078 Road 114W

Ms. Krysko,

In April 2024 the RM of Cornwallis (the RM) contacted BMCE to discuss and implement improvements to the southern 185m of Marsden Road (immediately north of Highway 459) to address concerns regarding saturation, washouts, washboard, and soft shoulders. Marsden Road is located on the boundary between the RM of Cornwallis (east side) and the RM of Whitehead (west side). A design including geotextile fabric, a more robust granular section, a crown, and weeping tile was completed and installed in Fall 2024.

During the design, the RM of Cornwallis and BMCE met with the homeowner located at 58078 Road 114W (within the RM of Whitehead) to discuss the removal of the southernmost approach to their property to aid in drainage efforts along Marsden Road. The homeowner expressed a desire to keep the approach, and it was therefore incorporated into the design.

During Spring 2025 melt, Marsden Road experienced ice damming and surface saturation caused by the southernmost approach. Buried utilities and ditch side-slopes prevent the ditch inverts on either side of the approach from being further lowered to allow for more holding capacity. Site drainage from 58078 Road 114W continues to flow from the property and down the steep slope of the southernmost approach leading to continued erosion of the west shoulder of Marsden Road.

It is BMCE's opinion that the continued use of this approach will cause further water build-up and erosion issues which will lead to deterioration of the recent improvements to Marsden Road. BMCE recommends that the RM request and obtain approval from the RM of Whitehead to remove this approach to increase the longevity of the improvements and road conditions in this location. The property in question currently has three approaches, one of which is only 25 metres north of the southernmost approach; it is BMCE's opinion that access to the property will not be significantly affected.
